Beneficial News

Thank you for the warm welcome which I received from your various congregations when I was able to join you to lead worship on Advent Sunday, at the Midnight Christmas Service at St James', East Malling and on Sunday, 10

you, I — and countless Christians the world over and possibly many others beside — are embarking on a journey which will take us through the seasons of Lent, Passiontide, Holy Week and on to Easter. What a journey! What a destination! In some places across the century, Lent was the season to prepare people for Christian baptism at Eastertide — and for many people that tradition feeds into a modern pattern of learning in Lent, of Lenten study groups and discussion groups, Lent books and the like. Whether we are the most devout of Christians or someone with little regular church involvement, this season can, nevertheless, allow us an opportunity to reflect on the journey of Jesus during the period of his adult public ministry, — a time when he faced temptation and testing, when people were drawn to him and where people sometimes withdrew from him, where he gave unforgettable teachings to those who heard him and to those who passed them down to others across the generations, even to ourselves. It was a period when he did physical miracles (eg healings, even the restoration of people from death, but also the multiplication of loaves and fishes to feed the hungry and the stilling of the storm to save his fearful disciples). It was a time, too, when he would be betrayed and denied by some of those closest to him. He would be beaten and unjustly condemned by those with physical and political power. It culminated in his crucifixion, when he would say those sublime words about those who were putting him to death — "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do" and to the penitent thief dying beside him ("Today you will be with me in Paradise") and, on Easter morning, an empty tomb and discarded grave clothes would bear witness to the reality of his resurrection. This led to people encountering him, risen, alive and eternal, in their very presence in the morning and the afternoon and the evening in Galilee of the North and in and beyond Jerusalem in the South, whether meeting him face-toface singly, or in small groups or — according to St Paul — in a crowd of more than 500 people at one time. In his death and resurrection existence was transformed, hope restored and a pattern for the future was open to be embraced by those who would follow him in faith. Do take an opportunity, through these weeks of February and March this year, to read something afresh of that journey of Jesus. Put yourself in the picture of the stories which you read and imagine him speaking his words to you, or you witnessing the deeds which he was doing. Respond afresh to him when you hear his voice coming to you from the pages of Scripture, so lovingly preserved for us by those of former generations and so powerfully used by the living Spirit of God to share himself with us today and to invite us on the journey of Christian faith in our own time and generation. May God bless you over these days which help us to prepare for the

triumph of Easter. Best wishes,
